The Birthplace of America Trail (BoAT) is a multi-use trail that will be the centerpiece of a regional active transportation network and economic driver connecting the Virginia Capital Trail in Richmond, Virginia to the numerous waterfront communities of Hampton Roads. The trail is designed as a shared-use path with several points of access to Colonial National Historic Park, including Historic Jamestowne, the Yorktown Battlefields, and Cape Henry as well as the Fort Monroe National Monument. The trail will enhance non-motorized transportation and tourism, as well as recreational and health and wellness opportunities for hundreds of thousands of Virginia residents, many of whom come from historically underserved communities. The entire BoAT will be approximately 190 miles when completed.

The trail section included in this FLAP application is approximately 2.6 miles in length and is located completely within Newport News Park. It provides direct access to the historic tour roads of the Yorktown Battlefield Complex within the Colonial National Historical Park, which are currently used by both pedestrians and bicyclists. The City of Newport News is planning to expand trailhead parking at the Newport News Park campground office to accommodate the anticipated increased use. The trail cross-section will be a minimum 10-foot wide, paved (bituminous) shared-use path that will generally conform to VDOT Complete Streets: Bicycle and Pedestrian Facility Guidelines, Bus Stop Design, and Parking Guidelines Appendix A(1) in association with local engineering standards. The shared-use path will allow visitors in Newport News Park to walk or ride a bike to directly access the national park as opposed to driving into Yorktown, helping to reduce vehicular emissions and congestion.

The total project cost is approximately \$7.1 million with the City requesting the full project amount in its FLAP application.

The Hampton Roads Transportation Planning Organization (HRTPO) is spearheading efforts to coordinate the planning and construction of the BoAT as a key active transportation facility for the region.

The staff of the HRTPO has reviewed the proposed project and it is included in the 2045 Long-Range Transportation Plan. Should this project be selected under the FLAP Grant Program and sufficiently funded, it will be added to the Transportation Improvement Program within a reasonable time.
