

**AGENDA ITEM #9: DRIVE-THRU QUEUE STACKING REQUIREMENTS IN VIRGINIA CITIES:
FINAL

Having dealt recently with queues at some fast-food restaurants spilling back into adjacent roadways and understanding that some cities vary their stacking requirements by commercial use (e.g. fast-food, drug store, bank, etc.), the City of Virginia Beach asked the HRTPO to research and document other cities' queue stacking requirements by commercial use.

Localities evaluating the appropriateness of their stacking requirements can use this research to compare their stacking requirements to those of other cities.

The draft report was presented to the TTAC at its June meeting and made available for public review and comment from June 2, 2021 through June 16, 2021. No comments were received.

Mr. John Mihaly, HRTPO Principal Transportation Planner, will brief the TTAC on this item.
