Come and see the proposed project plans for capacity improvements on I-64 in the City of Chesapeake. The proposed project includes widening I-64 from 4 to 6 lanes from 0.6 mile east of I-264 (at Bowers Hill) to 0.9 mile east of I-464. The new lanes (one in each direction) will be built in the existing median and will operate as managed lanes. The project also includes a new High Rise Bridge south of the existing bridge. The existing bridge will carry the three (3) I-64 Eastbound lanes; the new bridge will carry the three (3) I-64 Westbound lanes.
